Scholarships and Financial Resources



To qualify for the following University of Maine System (UMS) Scholarships, students:

- Must be a resident of the state of Maine.
- Must be a matriculated student in a University of Maine System degree or credential program.
- Must be registered at least part time: six to eight credits per semester.
- Must be considered an independent student and demonstrate financial need, as identified by the FAFSA.
- Maintain continuous enrollment and GPA of 2.0 or higher for renewed funding

Adult Degree Completion Scholarship

- Must have a two year gap (or more) since the last college attempt from any institution.
- Must have a minimum of 30 credits earned from any institution toward your degree.

Opening Doors Scholarship

 Must be a newly enrolled student pursuing a bachelors or associates degree; OR seeking a credential in a high demand field as identified by the Maine Department of Labor

UMS Small Debt Forgiveness



The University of Maine System (UMS) Small Debt Forgiveness Program erases small past balances for students wanting to obtain a degree/credential.

Criteria

Students must:

- Have a past due balance of \$2,500 or less owed at a UMS campus
- Be a Maine resident
- Be taking at least 6 credits towards a degree or certificate program
- Be considered Independent on the FAFSA
- Have at least a 2 year gap between college attempts







Students work with a UMS Success Coach, in conjunction with a campus academic advisor and other student support staff, to create a plan and to stay on track towards their goal.

How It Works

One half of the prior debt will be forgiven after one successfully completed semester. The second half will be forgiven after the successful completion of the second consecutive semester.
